Edna Pettipas and Marshall Pettipas have initiated a lawsuit against Bell Aliant Regional Communications Inc. The Pettipas' allowed Bell Aliant to place a cell phone tower on their land based on the representation that it posed no health risk. The Pettipas' claim against Bell Aliant for breach of contract where they relied on Bell Aliant's representation that there was no health risk. The Pettipas' allege that cell phone towers do pose a health risk for people with particular sensitivities and that Bell Aliant knew of these issues but did not bring them to the attention of the Pettipas'. The Pettipas' had a vacant lot upon which they were planning on building a home. They built a brand new home shortly after the cell phone tower was installed but cannot occupy it. The brand new home remains vacant. The Pettipas' lawyer, Jamie MacGillivray, says that "Bell Aliant should have disclosed the risks before entering into a lease with Ms. Pettipas. She now has a beautiful brand new Cape Cod style home that she cannot live in. The Pettipas' are encountering difficulties financially trying to keep up a mortgage on two homes. Cell phone towers are a modern reality, but before Bell Aliant put the tower on the Pettipas' land, they should have warned them of the risk".
